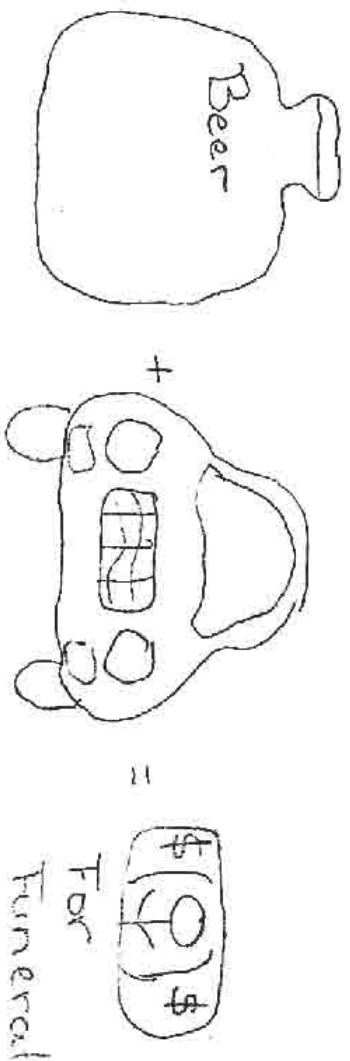
Sobriety Checkpoints Legal in the States
